<u>Professional profile</u> (Expertise, degrees, current position, previous positions)

Christos is a Research Assistant Professor at New York University Grossman School of Medicine, Department of Psychiatry and the Nathan S. Kline Institute for Psychiatric Research. Currently, his work focuses on developing novel approaches to treat abnormal electrical activity and memory impairments in epilepsy and in Alzheimer's disease. To that end he is employing large scale *in vivo* electrophysiology and closed-loop neurostimulation approaches to control in real time electrophysiological hallmarks of epilepsy and early-stage Alzheimer's disease.

<u>Scientific profile</u> (Research interests, publication record, distinctions & awards)

Christos' research interests are focused on the circuits and mechanisms underlying abnormal excitability in epilepsy and Alzheimer's disease. His Ph.D. work focused on the contribution of the cholinergic system in developmental epilepsy and his previous postdoctoral work on biomarkers of epilepsy following traumatic brain injury. He is currently developing novel closed-loop protocols in animal models of neuropsychiatric disease with a focus on high frequency oscillations.
